Fr Jonathan writes from the Mariapolis in Norwich.

"There have been about 500 people here at the Mariapolis, with a very high percentage of young people. The Mariapolis attempts to be what its name says, "A city of Mary", not that we have any "processions" or "devotions" to Mary, but rather the place where people try to make Jesus to be more consciously present among people. After all Mary gave Jesus birth in the flesh 2000 years ago, and if he is more consciously present among people and in individuals, it is not surprising that Mary is involved. As I write the majority of the Leyland people are on a boat trip on the Norfolk Broads. There has been a lot of giving of support for that be possible even for this boat trip. The young children have had their own programme each morning, while the adults had their programme. Many shared stories of the presence of Jesus in peoples' lives, their own or others. It was good to have a crowd of Irish people, mainly young, with us, and we from Leyland made a big contribution.

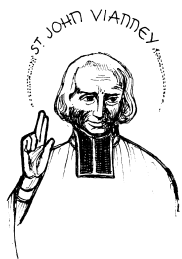

WORD OF LIFE

The kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls; on finding one pearl of great value, he went and sold all that he had and bought it. (Matt. 13: 45-46)

Perhaps we should learn from the 'little ones' to trust more in the Father's Providence. He does not withhold anything from those who, out of love, have given even the little they had. A group of young people in Congo, for some time now, have been making artistic greeting cards out of banana skins for sale in Germany. At first they kept all the profits (some of them used it to keep their entire family). Then they decided to share half the profit, and thirty five unemployed young people were helped. But God does not allow himself to be outdone in generosity. Two of these young men gave such a witness in the shop where they work that several traders came there to look for staff. And eleven of them found permanent jobs!
