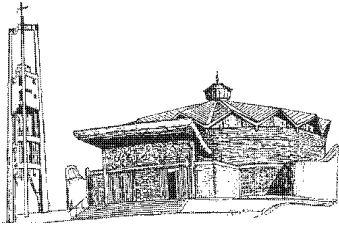

The Importance of Lent

"People in Lancashire are systematically emptying the Christian content of their lives" would be the conclusion of a recent statement by a thoughtful Catholic leader, Cardinal Vlk of Prague of the Czech Republic. The 77-year-old cardinal made his remarks in an interview to mark his retirement after spending 19 years as the leader of the Czech Church. He was referring to all Europeans. He said "Europe will pay dearly for having left its spiritual foundations and this is the last period when it may still have a chance to do something about it," those who do believe strongly in God are our Muslim brothers and sisters who are growing in strength and numbers all over Europe. Cardinal Vlk feels Islam will almost "rightly" fill the vacuum there is because so many in Europe have exchanged their Christian culture for an aggressive secularism that embraces atheism.

On Friday last, visiting, a very sick parishioner in RPH, there was a devout young Moslem girl opposite the Leyland person. She clearly had a strong faith in God, the same God that we worship. We would benefit if we learned to dialogue in love with all those believers in God of other faiths, as well as other Christians, both to learn from them and to give to them.

This depends on us having a strong Catholic faith!

Lent is a very graced time when all would do well to think and pray carefully about their own situation as Catholic Christians. This is the value of the different courses being offered this year in Lent. Thoughtful people say that unless we "belong" in some stronger way to God and the Church than Sunday Mass alone, we will find it difficult to maintain our Catholic Faith in the face of the "aggressive secularism and atheism" that surrounds us. Please consider this Lent:

- Daily Mass / Devotions such as the Stations
- Prepare for the PA celebration of reconciliation: Rite B Monday 28th March at 7.00pm in Church
- Prayerful spiritual reading (especially Wednesday Word or the Word of Life or the Scriptures)
- Meeting with Fr. Paul Mondays 11am-12noon
- Living Faith Sessions on Tuesdays of March 7.15 - 9.15pm, organised by the Archdiocese; Leaders are Fr. Tony Singo and Steve Atherton. (see leaflets and you must book; only 8 places left; for our Pastoral Area)
- Wednesdays 7.30pm with Fr. Stephen
- Wed. 24th Feb & 3rd March 7.30pm with Fr. Terence at St. Mary's Brownedge Church on the Parables. Wed. 17th, 24th, 31st March with Fr. Augustine on the Suffering Servant songs in Isaiah. (see the board)
- Thursdays 7.30pm "Living Life to the Full" with Fr. Ambrose (see below)
- Thursdays 7.30-9.00pm Leyland URC Church Hough Lane: The Passion. 6 weeks of discussion based on the acclaimed BBC series. (see board)
- Friday's 7.30pm Scripture course with Sister Veronica at Alverna.

Life to the Full: 5 sessions on the 5 Thursdays of Lent at 7.30 p m. We may be faithful Catholics, but it is easy to miss the real richness of our Faith and the value of the Scriptures.

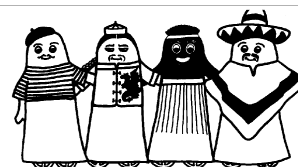
