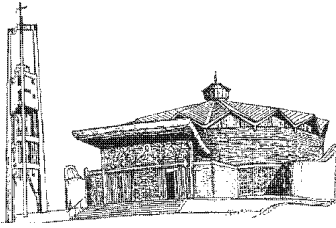

No Journey in faith or Youth Group – Half term: starts again next week.

Archbishop Patrick spoke of the gift of the 2nd Vatican Council at the funeral of Fr. Kevin Finn of Sts. Peter & Paul Mawdesley of our Pastoral Area on Wednesday 4th February: *“And today I bear witness and give thanks for the fidelity of Kevin and so many other priests, religious, men and women, to the pruning, correcting, renewing, transforming, transfiguring Second Vatican Council. This moment demands a word from me to those who feel confused, bruised by the general apparent implications and the specific hideous holocaust-denying element of the lifting of the excommunication of the four Bishops who rejected and encouraged others to reject the Second Vatican Council. They rejected the renewal of worship, grounded in a deeper understanding of the Mass, the Lord's Supper and our whole life of prayer and praise: they rejected the ecumenical charter, gloriously affirmed in Liverpool's Hope Street in the monument to Bishop David Sheppard and Archbishop Derek Worlock; a monument to a journey that was searching, often difficult, never simplistic. They rejected such documents as those that insisted we must walk a new way with those live the Jewish faith, the Muslim and other religions.*

This moment, the funeral of a priest who since his ordination fifty-seven years ago, had to work through the demands for his heart, his mind, his spirit, a Council: such a moment, the death of a big man, a priest of massive zeal, encourages us all to surrender again to be renewed through, by, in for that gift brought to be through Pope John XXII and accomplished by the leadership of Pope Paul VI. And it is utterly certain it will continue to bear fruit, as it has already abundantly done, in peace and goodness.”

Full text of the Archbishop's homily is on our website, as is an unofficial translation from the Secretary of State of the Vatican about disturbing reactions in regards the lifting of excommunication on four Bishops ordained by Archbishop Lefebvre.

WORD OF LIFE

Whoever comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, yes, and even life itself, cannot be my disciples. Lk 14:26

These words hold true in every age, including our own. They apply to all Christians, including you.

In a world like today's you will have many chances to put this invitation of Christ into practice.

Is someone in your family opposed to Christianity? Jesus wants you to bear witness to him with your life and when the time is right, with words too, even at the cost of ridicule or slander.

Are you expecting a child and your husband is asking you to terminate the pregnancy? Obey God, and not man.

Does your brother want you to join a group whose aims are suspicious or even wrong? Have nothing to do with it.

Has a relative offered you illegal money? Keep your honesty.

Does your whole family want to get you mixed up in worldly permissiveness? Make a cut, so that Christ will not withdraw from you.

Monastic Saints this week

These words are the beginning of the Rule of St. Benedict. This week we have the feasts of monastic Saints: **St. Scholastica**, the twin sister of St. Benedict who set up convents for women who wanted to follow his way; **St Benedict Aniane** who set up monasteries following the way of St. Benedict. He became the person in charge of

almost all the monasteries in the empire of Charlemagne, and he died in 821. **Sts Cyril and Methodius** also lived in the 9th Century. They followed the monastic way of the East, based on the way of St. Basil; but they would have known and respected the way of the Benedictines. On Thursday the feast of **Our Lady of Lourdes** and all monks love Our Lady.

How do we listen with the ear of the heart? In the Holy Rule of Benedict we gain answers, and here are some:

- Following the Word of God: his rule is based on the Gospels cf *Start of Chapter 7*
- To love God above all and everyone cf. *Chapter 4*
- To be obedient to the Will of God as Jesus was, knowing we are obedient to God by being obedient to our superiors and all people. Cf *Prologue and Chapter 5*
- To recognise the differences between people: cf. *Chapter 72 or Chapter 2*
- To be devoted to prayer especially in common cf *Ch 50*

What is the effect of this listening? Above all to build up a sense of family among people, the basis of civilisation. This is why St. Benedict and Sts Cyril and Methodius are among Patrons of Europe. Think how this may apply to you!
