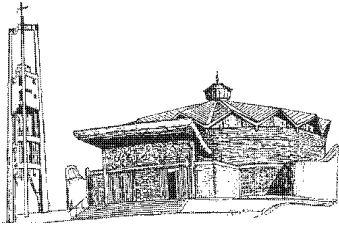

### **WORD OF LIFE**

*"Now the whole group of those who believed was of one heart and soul, and no one claimed private ownership of any possessions, but everything they owned was held in common."*

(Acts 4,32)

In these words the author of the Acts of the Apostles paints one of the pictures we have of the first Christian community in Jerusalem. It's shown as characterized by tremendous freshness and spiritual dynamism, by prayer and witness. Above all, it has a great unity, which Jesus wanted to be the unmistakable hallmark and the source of fruitfulness for his Church. The Holy Spirit, given in baptism to all who welcome the word of Jesus, is the spirit of love and unity. It was he, therefore, who made all the believers one with the risen Lord and with each other, enabling them to overcome all differences of race, culture and social class.
